## Yard Maintenance Reminders!

It's that time of year again when we need to kick off the season with regular yard maintenance. We will be sending courtesy notices for homes in need of attention, followed by fine notices for homes remaining in non-compliance.

Here are the House Rules on lawn maintenance:

- a) Includes the maintenance of any street or alley adjacent to the Lot by the homeowner.
- b) Grass and vegetation shall not grow over sidewalks, curbs, walkways, or driveways.
- c) Grass shall be cut regularly and shall not exceed six (6) inches in height.
- d) Weeds shall be removed before blooming.
- e) Shrubbery or tree branches extending over any sidewalk, street, alley, or other public way shall be trimmed so they do not obstruct vision or the travel of motorists and pedestrians, including people with disabilities.
- f) Overgrown and dry or dead grass, weeds, bushes, or trees shall be considered a fire and safety hazard and a nuisance. Dead plants and trees are to be removed.

You may have noticed that our Management Company, MacPherson's, switched to a new online portal. Through this portal you can make payments, submit ACRs and submit Maintenance Requests if you see something in the neighborhood that needs attention. Please take a moment to also verify that your contact information is correct. You should have received a link earlier this year to register. # Garbage and Recycle Bins

Garbage and recycle bins should be put out the night before pickup and put away the same day as pick-up. Please ensure that you are placing bins on the street (wheels to the curb) and not on the sidewalk. We have neighbors that need sidewalk access for wheelchairs and strollers. Let's not make their walk turn into an obstacle course.

### **HOME SAFETY & SECURITY**

Thefts and burglaries are common, to some extent, for most suburban communities. We typically see an increase of this during summer months. Homeowners become more vulnerable to such crimes when doors and windows are left open or unlocked, gates are unsecured, and cars are parked in plain view. But there are things you can do to minimize the likelihood of such damage and loss.

- > Be sure to secure your home by keeping all windows and doors locked unless you are home and awake.
- > Remember to remove valuables from your car and ensure it's always locked. Park in the garage if possible.
- Install an alarm system or make sure you turn on an existing alarm when you aren't home.
- ➤ Keep the outside of your home well-lit and use motion detecting lights.

If you see any suspicious or criminal activity, please dial 9-1-1 immediately.

If it isn't reported, the police don't know there's a problem.

# **Common Community Concerns**

#### Vehicles are speeding down the street.

The Homeowners Association has no control over traffic laws. If you see a car speeding it is best to reach out to local authorities. We have had multiple speed tests performed on Harbour Heights Blvd. It was determined by the county that we do not qualify for speed bumps or additional signage. In 2022 speed limit reminders were painted onto the surface of the road.

#### I'm worried about a tree in the greenbelt.

All greenbelt concerns should be submitted to the board. We will then review with an arborist or landscaper to determine the course of action necessary, if any. Legally speaking, owners are allowed to trim branches that extend over their fence/property line. It is always advised to communication with the HOA regardless.

#### I'd like to know details on the HOA Budget.
